I can pray a rainbow...

Genesis 9 v 13

"I am putting my rainbow in the clouds as the sign of the agreement between me and the earth"



God placed a rainbow in the sky as a symbol of his promise to never again send a flood like the one that Noah had survived in the ark. Today the rainbow is a symbol of hope for us, a reminder that God keeps his promises. Here are some rainbow inspired activities for you and your family to explore together.

Rainbow prayer hunt

Go on a search around your house and try to find something of each of the colours below. Here is a prayer you can say for each colour as you find them.



Thank you, God, that you love us and that you are always with us.



Dear God, please help us to be patient, to wait and listen to you and to be obedient while we wait for this crisis to end.

YELLOW

Dear God, please help all those who are scared. May they know your perfect peace that takes away all

GREEN



Dear God, please look after all those who are sick, give them the treatment and help they need to recover, send your healing power into all the world.

BLUE



Dear God, please protect all those who are working for the NHS, thank you for all they are doing to protect us.

PURPLE



Thank you, God, that we are children of the King of Kings. Thank you that even though we are in difficult times we can trust in you and pray your Kingdom come.

PINK



Thank you, God, that we know you will bring us through this crisis to safety on the other side just as you protected Noah and brought him and his family through the flood.

Make an encouragement rainbow

You will need: Paper and pens or any other craft materials you have around the house

All around the country people are putting rainbows in their windows to encourage people in their street.

Some promises to share

Here are some more of God's promises from the Bible. Ask God who needs encouraging today and then send them a promise verse.

Joshua 1:9- Be strong and brave. Don't be afraid because the LORD your God will be with you everywhere you go.

Jeremiah 29:11 - "I say this because I know what I am planning for you," says the LORD, "I have good plans for you, not plans to hurt you. I will give you hope and a good future."

Romans 8:28 - We know that in everything God works for the good of those who love him.

A passage to unpack

Find the book of Psalms in the Old Testament and read Psalm 23.



A psalm is a poem, this one was written by King David, the same David who defeated Goliath! Before he was a King David was a shepherd boy, he recognised that God looks after us like a shepherd looks after his sheep.

Draw a sheep here!



Verse 1 reminds us that just like a shepherd God provides everything we need. Write or draw something in the space below that you can say thank you to God for providing.



Verse 4 reminds us that wherever we are God is with us, even in tough times or when we are worried or fearful. The Bible tells us we should give all our worries to God.

Write or draw any fears or worries in this box, then tear this corner off the sheet and throw it in the bin as you give those worries to God.

Verse 3 talks about how God our shepherd leads us on paths that are right. When we are children of God, we can choose to live in a way that pleases God. Our helper Holy Spirit helps us make good choices about how we live.

Deuteronomy 24 v 19-22

When you are gathering your harvest in the field and leave behind a bundle of grain, don't go back and get it. Leave it there for foreigners, orphans, and widows so that the LORD your God can bless everything you do. When you beat your olive trees to knock the olives off, don't beat the trees a second time. Leave what is left for foreigners, orphans, and widows. When you harvest the grapes in your vineyard, don't pick the vines a second time. Leave what is left for foreigners, orphans, and widows. Remember that you were slaves in Egypt; that is why I am commanding you to do this.

Celebrate Harvest together with our grain challenge



Give some food to a local food bank or community fridge to share with those in need.



Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Repair! Harvest is a great time to think of our own environmental impact. What can your family do to save our planet?



Ask somebody in your community if you can do their food shopping for them this week or collect anything they need from the shops.



Invite somebody to share a meal with you. If you cannot meet because of social distancing why not arrange to drop off a meal which they can heat up and join together virtually as you eat.



Get out into **nature** together and spend some time thanking God for the many different plants and animals He has created.

We offer drinks & snacks for adults and children. Please bring your own beakers and lidded mugs. We note that outside snacks can not be eaten during the session due to allergies.


