

#### To make an Easter Garden you will need

\*A shallow tray or dish \*Garden soil or compost

\*Moss, cut grass or sand \*Dried twigs \*Small pot \*Sewing thread

\*Small pot \*Flat stone large enough to cover the mouth of the pot

\* small pots /containers \*Small flowers \*Gravel & white material


#### To Make:


- 1. Fill the tray with soil or potting compost.
- 2. Arrange it to make a hill on one side of the tray.
  - 3. Cover the soil with moss, grass or sand.
- 4. Make three crosses with dried twigs tied together with sewing thread and place on the hilltop.
  - 5. Press the small pot into the hillside to make a cave like the garden tomb. Place the white materials inside and place the stone over the mouth of the tomb.
  - 6. Press egg-cups full of water into soil around the garden & fill with flowers.
    - 7. Make a path coming from the tomb with gravel, to show how the disciples ran to the tomb on Easter morning.
- 8. Early on Easter morning, move back the stone from the tomb ~ showing that it is empty apart from the white cloth in which Jesus' had been wearing



All about Easter Eggs

There are lots of eggs at Easter! We can search for hidden eggs, decorate eggs or eat delicious eggs made from chocolate. Christians believe that eggs can help us understand the story of Jesus dying and coming back to life.






#### New life

Eggs are a symbol of birth and new life! Christians believe that Jesus was born as a baby on the earth, God in human form. Jesus was sent to be an example for us and to help us to be friends with God.

#### What's inside?

Traditional easter eggs are hollow inside, Christians use this as a reminder of the tomb where Jesus was placed after he died. A large stone was placed in front of the tomb. When his friends visited the tomb, the stone had been rolled away and Jesus was gone.

Christians believe that Jesus had come back to life! Jesus' friends saw him walking and talking three days after his death, then he went to heaven.





## A gift for everyone

Christians believe that because Jesus died and came back to life there is hope for everyone. We are all invited to be a friend of God and to one day be with Him in heaven.


